

Summer Reading Projects

During the summer, the children are required to read 3 chapter books.

You may choose from any easy chapter books such as, Junie B. Jones, Arthur, Cam Jansen or Horrible Harry.

Your child will do one project for each book.

Book 1

Divide a piece of paper into 4 sections.

In the first section, write your name, the title and author of the book.

Write the names of the characters and the setting in section 2.

In section 3, briefly tell what happened in the beginning, middle and end of the story.

Tell why you liked the story in section 4.

Book 2

Make a bookmark for your book. Draw the main characters on the front. On the back, put your name, the title of the book and 3 things you liked about the book.

Book 3

Take a cereal box. Cover the box with paper. On the front of the box put the title, author and illustrator. Draw a picture of your book.

On the back of the box, write 5 sentences about your book. Tell what was your favorite part.

On the side of the box, write the name of the characters.

On the other side of the box, describe the setting of the story. The setting tells where and when the story took place.

Inside the box, put any object that was in the story. For example, if you read Charlottes Web, you might put a toy pig and spider in the box.

Bring the 3 projects on the first day of school in August.

These projects are your first three reading grades of the year!
